First International Science Prize 2023

Research Theme in 2023: Climate Change and Conflict

The Hans Günter Brauch Foundation (HGBS) < <http://hgb-stiftung.org/> > awards an international science prize (ISP) on scientific themes on peace, ecology and the Anthropocene. The prize is open to scholars working in peace and environmental studies, from all social science disciplines and countries. It is awarded annually based on an assessment by an International Jury <http://hgb-stiftung.org/html/Global_Jury.html>. The specific research themes change each year and are selected by the international jury. **The first international science prize (ISP) will be awarded in July 2023 in Mosbach** (Germany) and consists of a prize money of **3000 Euro**, an airline ticket to Frankfurt and a stay in a hotel in Mosbach.

- **Each scholar should submit an original text of research of the applicant in English that**
 - was published as an article in a peer-reviewed journal since January 2020 or
 - was published as a peer-reviewed book chapter since January 2020 or
 - is preferably an unpublished article, report or book (PhD dissertation or habilitation).
- **Applicants are invited to submit until 31 January 2023:**
 - A printed version of the text since January 2020 with all publication details;
 - A CV with the author's professional affiliation and all contact details;
 - A signed letter that the applicant has authored the submitted text.
