International Science Prize 2023 on Climate Change and Conflicts

An international jury <http://hgb-stiftung.org/html/Global_Jury.html> consisting of six male and female scientists from each continent of the HGB Foundation will award its first International Science Prize 2023 in Mosbach, Germany. The basis for the prize is an English text written by the author, which has either been published since January 2020

- in a peer-reviewed English scientific journal;
- in a peer-reviewed English scholarly anthology;

or as a previously unpublished scientific text (essay, report, book):

- such as an unpublished PhD dissertation or postdoctoral thesis
- or as a previously unpublished book manuscript.

The prize is endowed with a cash award of 3000 €, travel expenses and a hotel stay.

- In case of an unpublished book, a publication in the peer-reviewed book series: *The Anthropocene: Politics - Economy - Society - Science* published by *Springer Nature Switzerland* is possible.
