Second International Science Prize 2024 on Ecocide: Impacts of Wars and/or Climate Change on Food Security Since 1945

The Hans Günter Brauch Foundation (HGBS) for Peace and Ecology in the Anthropocene awards an international science prize (ISP) on: Ecocide: Impacts of Wars and/or Climate Change on Food Security Since 1945. According to the Modified Call of 1 May 2024 the Global Jury will accept three alternatives:

Ecocide: Impacts of Wars and/or Climate Change on Food Security since 1945 (original call of October 2023).

The Jury accepts (since 1 May 2024): in addition these two alternatives

- Ecocide: focusing on the political and legal concept that has been applied to two topical conflicts in Europe and in the Near East
- > Impacts of Wars and/or Climate Change on Food Security since 1945.

The first prize was awarded to Prof. Tobias Ide for: *Catastrophes, Confrontations and Constraints*. The award ceremony is at: http://hgb-stiftung.org/html/Award_winners.html>.

The ISP-2024 includes a prize money of **3.000 Euro** and is open to scholars from all disciplines and countries. Any scholar with a PhD may apply or be nominated until **31 May 2024** by submitting an original single-authored book or manuscript in English (PhD or habilitation thesis) published or approved since 2020.

- ❖ Applications by scholars with a PhD from any university globally
- * Nominations by scholars (professors) and heads of departments and institutes
 - by publishers who published English books since 2020-2024 on these themes;
 - > and by PhD Committees that passed PhD dissertations that are not yet published.

In addition to the International Science Prize the Global Jury of the HGBS ISP 2024 may award again *International Recognitions* for unpublished manuscripts.

Applications and nominations should include:

- o a 300-500 word abstract and an electronic version of the book or an unpublished work;
- o a CV, publication and the author's professional affiliation and contact details;
- o A signed letter that the applicant has authored the submitted text.
